
School Update

Message from Mr. Knight,

I would like to say a big 'well done' to all our children! They have worked so hard since returning to school last September and it is great to see how much they have learnt this term. Thank you also to all our parents for the support you have given the school this term, it has been brilliant to hear all of the positive feedback.

It has been a busy time in Education over the past week or so with announcements made about tests and Ofsted. Routine Ofsted inspections have been cancelled until at least April. The DfE has announced that Year 6 children will only be sitting Maths and Reading tests and there will be no SPAG test. The Year 2 children won't be sitting any test at all this year and schools will only report teacher assessment data in Reading, Writing and Maths. Education is a rapidly changing landscape!

With regards to any COVID positive cases over the two week Christmas break, you only need to contact school (by email please), if your child was in school 2 days prior to the onset of symptoms, should they test positive. Or, if they test positive during the Christmas holidays and the 10 days after the onset of symptoms edges into the start of next term in January.

For example: Yasmin develops a cough on Saturday 19th December and receives a positive test result on Sunday 20th December. She was in school on Thursday 17th and Friday 18th December. Any contacts of Yasmin from the school on those days would need to be identified and advised to self-isolate.

As I am mentioning COVID matters, can I please urge parents who drop off children at 8.45am to disperse soon after and not stand around in small groups talking. Some parents have mentioned to me that parents congregating on pavements has made social distancing more difficult. Dispersing quickly after drop off will also help free up car parking. Thank you for your help with this.






Christmas at Bardsey






Book of the Week

At Children's Corner we follow children's individual interests and some of our pre-schoolers have been keen to practise their writing skills, which is fantastic. The children then demonstrated excellent pencil control as they carefully formed captions. It is so rewarding to see the children expressing themselves through interests that are meaningful to them and to witness their blossoming creativity.

Painting is a favourite activity for all ages, and we have enjoyed mixing colours and printing with our new Christmas stamps, creating some bright festive pictures. Taking Maths Outdoors

Here are some pictures of our Year 4 children doing some measuring work outside. At Bardsey we try to take advantage of our outdoor environment as much as possible to do work outside. Here, the children were estimating, then calculating the perimeter of a number of rectilinear shapes using their footsteps as a measuring tool. Very ingenious!
